Promotion Criteria for Tenure and Clinical Tracks

- Three Areas
 - Research/Scholarship
 - Teaching
 - Service/clinical activities



Promotion Criteria for Clinical tracks

- Traditional Clinical Track
 - Excellence in one
 - Strength in remaining two
- Clinician Educator and Practitioner
 - Excellence in one (Teaching or Clinical Service)
 - Strength in the remaining criterion
- Clinical Scholar and Educational Scholar
 - Specialized criteria



Research/Scholarship

- Publications
 - Peer-reviewed publications
 - Authorship, mentorship of trainees
 - Case reports/Letters
 - Invited Reviews
 - Book Chapters
- On-line scholarship (classes, courses can count)
- Research Grants
 - Federal peer-reviewed > non-federal > non-peer-reviewed
 - Clinical Trials
 - Foundation support (PR better than non-PR)
 - Pharmaceutical Companies
- Citations, H-index, cohort analysis
- Abstracts and presentations



Teaching

- Courses taught and developed (local and national)
- Lectures to undergraduate and graduate students, medical residents, fellows
- Postgraduate training courses given
- One-on-one mentoring in the laboratory
- Evaluations of instructional effectiveness
- List of graduate student trainees, their thesis projects, year of graduation, and current positions
- List of postdoctoral fellows, their research projects, years of training, and current positions



Traditional Clinical Track

- What constitutes "Excellence" vs "Strength"?
- Excellence in Scholarship:
 - Substantial number of peer-reviewed papers in clinical specialty journals, with first or senior authorship, chapters and invited reviews
 - Grant funding to some level (federal, state, pharmaceutical, foundation)
 - Invited to give local and national (international) talks in area of expertise
 - Awards



Traditional Clinical Track

- "Strength" in Scholarship:
 - Fewer papers, but evidence of having an impact in the area of expertise, or of moving the field forward.
 - Papers should be recent, since starting at USC
 - Peer reviewed publications, chapters, invited reviews, etc.
 - Smaller amounts of funding supporting research effort, possibly a clinical trial or two
 - At the minimum, invitations to speak on area of expertise locally and hopefully nationally



Clinician-Educator

(Educational/Clinical Service counts toward "85%" in profile of activities)

Educational Service

- Service on committees dealing with specialty training in which they are normally engaged
- Administrative activities in teaching programs (e.g., Fellowship directors)
- Coordination and management of training at local, regional, or national levels.

Clinical Service

- Management and administrative aspects of practice
- Division head or chief roles
- Development and leadership of clinical programs



Clinical Evaluations

- Evaluations requested from colleagues and supervisors:
 360°
- Evaluations can be filled out on-line, includes Likert scale and narrative; narrative letters also acceptable.
- Evaluations address:
 - General Clinical Proficiency
 - Communication
 - Professionalism
 - Health Care System
 - Other



Clinical Scholar

- Appointment and promotion with this designation is a high honor: review process is as rigorous as that used for tenure decisions and promotions.
- Granting the designator "Clinical Scholar" does not have to be at the same time as promotion or appointment
- The title "Clinical Scholar" will be granted by the President of the University following review by UCAPT and the Provost.
- Focus of research for candidates for the Clinical Scholar designation will be in the application of clinical science to clinical care.



Clinical Scholar (Cont.)

- Evidence that the candidate is recognized at the national level (or international level, as appropriate based on the rank) by experts in his/her field for leadership in important translational or clinical research.
- Evidence that there is a theme or focus to his/her research
 expertise that has had substantive national impact (e.g. a
 long track record of developing treatments for a particular
 disease or developing new and novel procedures for specific
 surgical problems).
- Evidence of excellence in scholarship: his/her scholarly peerreviewed publications are of appropriate quality and quantity for the proposed rank, and have they had an impact in the field



Appointment at Professor Rank in New Series

Clinician Educator

- Requires significant and sustained (years) educational and clinical leadership and/or administration
- Documented Excellence as Educator/Clinician

Practitioner

- Requires either substantial educational, clinical or administrative leadership experience in their background, even though they will no longer perform those activities, and evidence as shown below for promotion:
 - Clear evidence of substantial and sustained (years) leadership in hospital or clinical practice.
 - Documented Excellence in Clinical Practice

^{*}Appointment at Professor rank with either designation requires consultation with the Office for Faculty Affairs.
